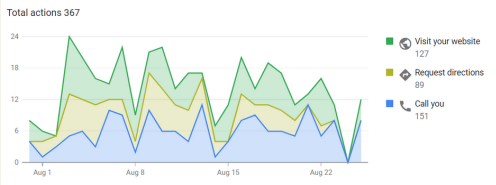

Childcare providers:

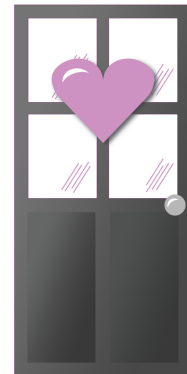
Volunteers will provide childcare during the daytime.
